12. The manner of execution of subsidy programmes, including the amounts allocated and the details of beneficiaries of such programmes.

12.1.1 As per the office Memorandum No. 44/44/2014-(RE) dated 03.12.2014, issued by the Ministry of Power, Government of India approved implementation of Deendayal Upadhyaya Gram Jyoti Yojana scheme for the rural areas with the following components

- (i) Separation of agriculture and non-agriculture feeders facilitating judicious rostering of supply to agricultural & non- agricultural consumers in the rural areas;
- (ii) Strengthening and augmentation of sub-transmission & distribution (ST&D) infrastructure in rural areas, including metering at distribution transformers, feeders and consumers end;
- (iii) Rural electrification, as per CCEA approval dated 01.08.2013 for completion of the targets laid down under RGGVY for 12th and 13th Plans by subsuming RGGVY in DDUGJY and carrying forward the approved outlay for RGGVY to DDUGJY;

12.1.2 The approval has been accorded for components (i) and (ii) above having scheme cost of Rs. 43,033 crore including a budgetary support of Rs. 33,453 crore from Government of India during the entire implementation period (balance period of 12th & 13th Plan).

12.1.3 The existing programme of erstwhile Rajiv Gandhi Grameen Vidyutikaran Yojana (RGGVY) as approved by CCEA for continuation in 12th and 13th Plans got subsumed in this scheme as a separate rural electrification component [component (iii) above] for which CCEA has already approved the scheme cost of Rs. 39,275 crore including a budgetary support of Rs. 35,447 crore. This outlay will be carried forward to the new scheme of DDUGJY in addition to the outlay indicated in Para 12.1.2 above.

12.1.4 Office Memorandum F.No. 44/44/2014-RE dated 3rd December 2014 issued by the Ministry of Power in respect of Deendayal Upadhyaya Gram Jyoti Yojana (DDUGJY).

The beneficiaries of this programme are the concerned State Governments.

12.2.1 As per the office Memorandum No. 44/2/2016-(RE) dated 11.10.2017, issued by the Ministry of Power, Government of India approved implementation of Pradhan Mantri Sahaj Bijli Har Ghar Yojana –“Saubhagya” scheme for the household electrification with the following scope:

- (i) Providing last mile connectivity and electricity connections to all un-electrified households in rural areas.
- (ii) Providing Solar Photo Voltaic (SPV) based standalone systems for un-electrified households located in remote and inaccessible villages / habitations, where grid extension is not feasible or cost effective.
- (iii) Providing last mile connectivity and electricity connections to all remaining economically poor un-electrified households in urban areas. Non-poor urban households are excluded from this scheme.

12.2.2 The approval has been accorded for scheme cost of Rs.16,320 crore including a budgetary support of Rs. 12,320 crore from Government of India during the entire implementation period.

12.2.3 Office Memorandum F.No. 44/2/2016-RE dated 11th October 2017 issued by the Ministry of Power in respect of Pradhan Mantri Sahaj Bijli Har Ghar Yojana –“Saubhagya”.

The beneficiaries of this programme are the concerned State Governments.
